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### SUMMARY

For over twenty years, NASTAD's National Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) Part B and AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) Monitoring Project (previously known as the National ADAP Monitoring Project) has documented key trends among ADAPs as well as challenges and successes experienced by these life-saving programs. In the National ADAP Monitoring Project's Annual Report published in 2017, NASTAD first incorporated data and topics for the broader RWHAP Part B program into the *Annual Report* in an effort to contextualize the realities of ADAP program structure, budgets, and utilization within the broader RWHAP Part B system. In this 2018 edition of the Annual Report, NASTAD has expanded the National ADAP Monitoring Project to the National RWHAP Part B and ADAP Monitoring Project. As such, the narrative and findings now span the totality of the RWHAP Part B program and reflect the reality that the achievements of ADAPs and other elements of the RWHAP Part B programs are inextricably linked.



#### RYAN WHITE

Ryan White was diagnosed with HIV following a blood transfusion in 1984. He was 13 years old at the time. Following his diagnosis, Ryan was barred from his Indiana school and became a "national hero" because of his fight to return to school. Ryan fought discrimination and stigma and became the face of public education about HIV and AIDS. Ryan White died in April 1990, months before the legislation bearing his name was passed.



The Part B program is the Part of the RWHAP infrastructure through which state and territorial health departments are funded to provide core medical and support services to eligible clients. The RWHAP Part B program includes the administration of ADAPs to ensure access to lifesaving treatment. As in other Parts of the RWHAP, Part B is administered by the Health Resources and Services Administration's HIV/AIDS Bureau (HRSA/HAB). All 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the six U.S. Pacific Territories/ Associated Jurisdictions are eligible for Part B program funding. Administration and service delivery of each jurisdiction's RWHAP Part B program is unique, reflecting the needs and challenges of the clients they serve as well as the political and structural landscape in which they exist.

Access to treatments, inclusive of antiretrovirals (ARVs), "A1" opportunistic infection (OI) medications, and medications to treat other comorbid conditions (e.g., hepatitis C (HCV), substance use, mental health) is critical but not sufficient in ensuring optimal health outcomes (e.g., viral suppression) among PLWH. The full complement of RWHAP Part B services support adherence to, and the overall effectiveness of, treatment. In implementing a seamless, nimble, and effective RHWAP Part B program, ADAPs and other core medical/support services must functionally align in terms of funding, administration, infrastructure, service delivery, and overall purpose.



## RWHAP PART B PROGRAM FUNDING AND STRUCTURE

### OVERVIEW OF THE RWHAP PART B PROGRAM

RWHAP Part B programs were created under the Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS Resources Emergency (CARE) Act, passed by Congress and signed into law by President George H.W. Bush in 1990. This landmark, bipartisan legislation was enacted to sustain a responsive care system as a "payer of last resort" (i.e., source of care for those under- or uninsured via private insurance, Medicaid, Medicare) for people living with HIV (PLWH). In providing RWHAP funds directly to states and territories, legislators created a structure in which a nationwide response to the needs of PLWH was available. As with other Parts of the law, RWHAP Part B programs deliver an array of services, both medical (core medical) and non-medical (support), to assist clients in achieving sustained virologic suppression and overall optimal health and well-being. Allowable RWHAP Part B program services collectively reflect the diverse and unique experiences of PLWH as well as a commitment to a patient-centered model for care delivery.



The Drug Reimbursement Program was first implemented in 1987 via Congressional appropriation to provide the newly Food & Drug Administration (FDA)-approved treatment, zidovudine (AZT), to PLWH without private insurance or ineligible for Medicaid, Medicare, or other state programs. These state-based programs were absorbed into the then RWHAP Title II program in 1990 and were subsequently changed to "AIDS Drug Assistance Programs" in 1996. Over time, ADAPs have expanded their coverage (i.e., their drug formularies) in accordance with the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Section 2616(c)(6) of the Public Health Service Act. They have also increased their capacity in supporting clients via ADAP-funded insurance continuation.

### THE NATIONAL RWHAP PART B PROGRAM BUDGET

RWHAP was last reauthorized in 2009 and the most recent authorization ended on September 30, 2013. In the absence of Congressional action on authorization, the program continues to operate as Congress maintains annual appropriations to the program. Based on a formula and eligibility-based distribution mechanism, RWHAP Part B programs are eligible to receive the following categories of federal funding: Part B Base, Part B Supplemental (if applicable), Part B ADAP Earmark, Part B ADAP Supplemental (if applicable), and ADAP Emergency Relief Funding (if applicable). In FY2017, RWHAP Part B programs (n=59) were Congressionally appropriated a total of \$1.4 billion, with \$898.8 million appropriated to ADAP specifically (i.e., via Part B ADAP Earmark (n=59), Part B ADAP Supplemental (n=9), and ADAP Emergency Relief Funding (n=9)).

RWHAP Part B programs have discretion to allocate a portion or all their Part B Base and/or Part B Supplemental to ADAP. For FY2017, 26 RWHAP Part B programs reported having allocated



at least some portion of their RWHAP Part B Base and/or Part B Supplemental to ADAP. As the largest component to the RWHAP Part B program with the greatest number of clients served, ADAPs represented 75% of the overall Part B budget in FY2017. The proportion of the RWHAP Part B budget used for ADAP ranged from 0% in the Federated States of Micronesia to 99.9% in New York. Between 1996, the earliest year in which NASTAD has collected this data, and 2017, the total ADAP budget has grown 892% with an average growth of 13% per year. Yet these awards alone do not meet the needs of RWHAP Part B programs or their clients. Instead, jurisdictions must often seek additional funding opportunities to sustain their infrastructure and service delivery.

Additional sources that may be available to RWHAP Part B programs include other federal funding (e.g., carry-over from prior Part B Base or ADAP Earmark awards), state general revenue funding, private donations, and rebates received as part of medication purchasing. RWHAP Part A programs in eligible metropolitan areas may contribute directly-appropriated funds to their Part B counterparts. Such decisions are made locally and reflect an effort between RWHAP Parts A and B programs to mutually ensure each other's success in serving the needs of PLWH. Taken together, these additional funding sources make up 4% of the FY2017 RWHAP Part B program and 5% of ADAP budgets.

#### 1987

First antiretroviral (AZT, an NRTI) approved by the FDA; Federal government provides grants to states to help them purchase AZT, marking beginning of federally funded. state-administered "AZT Assistance Programs."

#### 1990

ADAPs incorporated into Title II of the newly created Ryan White CARE Act.

#### 1995

First protease inhibitor approved by FDA, and the highly active antiretroviral therapy (HAART) era begins.

#### 1996

First reauthorization of CARE Act-federal ADAP earmark created: first non-nucleoside reverse transcriptase inhibitor

#### 2000

Second reauthorization of CARE Act. Changes for ADAPs include: allowance of insurance purchasing and maintenance: flexibility to provide other limited services (e.g., adherence support and outreach); and creation of ADAP supplemental grants programt.

#### 2003

NASTAD's ADAP Crisis Task Force formed to negotiate with pharmaceutical companies on pricing of antiretroviral medications; first fusion inhibitor approved by FDA.

#### 2004

President's ADAP Initiative (PAI) announced, allocating \$20 million in one-time funding outside of the ADAP system to reduce ADAP waiting lists in 10 states.

#### 2006

Third reauthorization of the CARE Act, now called, "Title XXVI of the PHS Act as amended by the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act of 2006" or the "Ryan White Program." Changes for ADAP include: new formula for determining state awards, which incorporates living HIV and AIDS cases; new minimum formulary requirement; and an increase in the ADAP Supplemental set-aside and changes in eligibility and matching requirements.

#### 2007

New minimum formulary requirement effective July 1; first CCR5 antagonist and integrase inhibitor approved by FDA.

#### 2009


Fourth reauthorization of the Ryan White Program. The reauthorization was for four years and included several technical changes.

#### 2010

Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) signed into law. ADAP emergency funding announced by the Obama Administration, allocating \$25 million in funding to address ADAP waiting lists and cost-containment measures.

#### 2011

ADAP emergency funding continued at \$40 million. In December 2011. President Obama announced an additional \$35 million for ADAPs to address ADAP waiting lists and cost containment measures. Awards from this funding will be available to states based on a competitive application.



#### 2012

ADAP emergency funding awarded at \$75 million, including the continuation of FY2011 funding the allocation of an additional \$35 million announced by President Obama in December 2011.

#### 2013

Open enrollment for insurance through the insurance marketplace

#### 2014

The first open enrollment period for insurance through the insurance marketplace established under the Affordable Care Act ends on March 31. 2014. The second open enrollment period begins on November 15, 2014.



# A SYNERGISTIC AND COMPLEMENTARY SYSTEM OF CARE

### HOW RWHAP PART B PROGRAMS FUNCTION

RWHAP Part B programs are comprised of the following key components: core medical/support service delivery, including ADAP; quality management (i.e., a series of activities that focus on enhancing the quality of HIV care provided and increasing access to services); and program administration (i.e., administrative, planning and evaluation, salaries, overhead, client eligibility and enrollment, and data system management and reporting). Depending on the programmatic structure, staffing, and capacity, RWHAP Part B programs may elect to contract out one or more of these key components to an external organization. Twenty-three RWHAP Part B programs reported doing so in 2016 with administrative and quality management cited as the activities most commonly externalized.


The RWHAP Part B program provides services to eligible clients via core medical and support services, each of which might be delivered to clients directly by the state/territory health department or by a sub-recipient agency. In calendar year 2016, 33 RWHAP Part B programs reported contracting with one or more sub-recipient agency by individual client service and 36 programs funded sub-recipient agencies to provide multiple discrete services simultaneously. The majority of RWHAP Part B programs reported having funded greater than 15 sub-recipient agencies to deliver core medical and/or support services in their jurisdiction. Two programs funded one sub-recipient agency, seven funded two to five sub-recipient agencies, 18 funded five to ten sub-recipient agencies, and six funded ten to fifteen sub-recipient agencies. Additionally, RWHAP Part B programs may select different agency settings to fund through their procurement



processes. The types of sub-recipient agencies funded to provide core medical and/ or support services in calendar year 2016 vary considerably: standalone medical clinics operated within the health department (18 RWHAP Part B programs) or external to the health department (31 RWHAP Part B programs); clinics integrated within hospitals or similar (e.g., federally qualified health centers (FQHCs)) operated by the health department (nine RWHAP Part B programs) or operated by an external organization (31 RWHAP Part B programs); AIDS Service Organizations (ASOs) (42 RWHAP Part B programs); non-ASO community-based organizations (CBOs) (36 RWHAP Part B programs); and other agencies (six RWHAP Part B programs). This reflects the diversity of the RWHAP Part B program services themselves and the varying capacity of sub-recipient organizations.

Across all sub-recipient agencies, RWHAP Part B programs must adhere to all category definitions specified in <a href="https://example.com/HRSA/HAB">HRSA/HAB</a> policy clarification notice (PCN) 16-02 and use at least 75% of federal RWHAP awards (e.g., Part B Base, Part B Supplemental) to fund core medical services (unless a <a href="https://example.com/475/25 waiver">#75/25 waiver</a>" is approved by HRSA/HAB). PCN 16-02 identifies multiple ways in which RWHAP Part B programs may deliver each discrete service category and gives flexibility to states and territories in customizing their provision of care.




### RWHAP PART B SERVICES' IMPACT ON CLIENTS' VIRAL LOAD SUPPRESSION

One overarching goal of the RWHAP Part B program is to assist clients in achieving viral suppression. To do so, they provide access to treatment and medical care as well as services that ensure continuous adherence to both. This includes but is not limited to insurance coordination/continuation services under ADAP and RWHAP Part B Health Insurance Premium and Cost-Sharing Assistance for Low-Income Individuals. ADAP-funded insurance programs support their clients in accessing medications and services necessary to ensure adherence to these treatments. Yet the RWHAP Part B premium and cost-sharing assistance allows for additional flexibility than ADAP-funded insurance alone in paying medical costs (e.g., it is not subject to the 5% cap on ADAP funding used for adherence, outreach, and monitoring services). In 2016, 28 RWHAP Part B programs reported having provided services to clients under Health Insurance Premium and Cost-Sharing Assistance for Low-Income Individuals. RWHAP Part B programs should deliver the full complement of insurance-related services to eligible clients, including but not limited to ADAP, to maximize their access to services that impact their viral load suppression and other health outcomes.

ADAP-funded insurance is defined as when an ADAP client is enrolled in insurance (public or private insurance) and the ADAP pays for part or all the clients' co-payments/cost-sharing assistance, deductibles, and/or premiums. ADAPs began purchasing insurance for clients in 2002 when HRSA specifically clarified this option. In calendar year 2016, 51 ADAPs reported using funds for insurance purchasing/continuation, representing \$398.2 million in estimated expenditures (20% of the total ADAP budget for the year) for 120,630 clients (52%), with an average cost per client of \$3,301. By comparison, 44 ADAPs reported using


#### CHART 4 RWHAP Part B Clients Served, by Viral Load, Calendar Year 2016

- Unknown



funds for insurance purchasing/continuation in 2013 (i.e., the last year before the Affordable Care Act (ACA) was fully implemented) for 35% of all clients served by ADAP. From 2013 to 2016, ADAPs have reported an average 6% increase each year in the proportion of clients served by insurance purchasing/continuation programs with the largest increase between years 2014 and 2015 (9%).

Among those clients served by ADAP-funded insurance, rates of viral suppression are significantly higher than among those served by the ADAP full-pay prescription program alone. The percentage of clients reported as virally suppressed among those served by ADAP-funded insurance only and those served by both the ADAP-funded insurance and the full-pay prescription programs is 84%. By comparison, just 79% of clients served by the full-pay prescription program only were reported as virally suppressed. This is likely because access to insurance ensures ADAP clients may seek a multitude of services that directly affect retention in care and adherence to treatment, including HIV medical care, substance use treatment, and mental health treatment, among others.

#### CHART 6 RWHAP Part B Clients Served and Top Ten States, by Clients Served, Calendar Year 2016




### CHART 7 ADAP Clients Served and Top Ten States, by Clients Served, Calendar Year 2016





#### CHART 8 ADAP Clients Served, by Program Type, Calendar Year 2016

- ADAP clients served by ADAP-funded insurance and full-pay prescription programs



### AFFECTING CHANGE AMONG A DIVERSE CLIENT POPULATION

### WHO ARE RWHAP PART B/ADAP CLIENTS?

The RWHAP Part B program, including ADAP, serves as a safety-net for people who are inherently low income and under or uninsured. To meet this charge, these programs must develop systems and processes that are responsive to challenges facing the individuals they serve. To do so, RWHAP Part B programs, including ADAPs, must reflect on who their clients are and how they can work to improve or target their systems to meet their needs.

As compared to the overall population in the United States, RWHAP Part B clients illustrate significant differences in demographics. RWHAP Part B program clients are more likely to be people of color (56% vs. 23%) and low income (i.e., at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL); 51% vs. 13%). Among RWHAP Part B clients served in 2016, 45% were Black/African American and Black/African American clients represent the majority (76%) of all RWHAP Part B clients reported as people of color. While RWHAP Part B programs should consider how best to deliver services to all people of color they serve, they must be mindful of the unique challenges faced by those within discrete racial demographic categories (e.g., Black/African American).



RWHAP Part B programs must also consider the needs of clients in the context of their ethnicity¹ and gender. The proportion of RWHAP Part B clients reported as Hispanic was 20% (as compared to 18% of the U.S. population). It is critical for RWHAP Part B programs to ensure services are accessible for Hispanic clients, including for those who are Spanish-speaking. The majority of RWHAP Part B clients (71%) were identified as male, 26% as female, and 1% as transgender. By comparison, 49% and 51% of the U.S. population in 2016 were reported as male and female, respectively². This difference is reflective of the disproportionate prevalence of HIV among men nationally; 76% of all adult PLWH in 2015 were male.

The National RWHAP Part B and ADAP Monitoring Project has captured data on ADAP clients for over 20 years. ADAP clients' demographic data reflect a similar and consistent picture from year to year. Yet there are differences between ADAP client demographics and those of the broader RWHAP Part B client population (see Chart 12: ADAP Clients Served, by Demographic, Calendar Year 2016). In calendar year 2016 39% of ADAP clients served were Black/African American (as compared to 45% of all RWHAP Part B clients), yet they represented a larger proportion of all clients of color (82% vs. 76%).

Twenty-six percent of ADAP clients were reported as having Hispanic ethnicity (compared to 20% of all RWHAP Part B clients). The availability of culturally- and linguistically-appropriate documentation (e.g., applications, policies) and services may be particularly important for ADAP clients. Fifty-five percent of all ADAP clients were at or below 139% FPL (vs. 62% of all RWHAP Part B clients). Finally, 78% of ADAP clients were reported as male (vs. 71% of all RWHAP Part B clients).

There also exist geographic variations in ADAP client demographics. The five ADAPs with the greatest percentage of clients at or below 139% FPL (Alabama, the District of Columbia, Georgia, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, and South Carolina) are predominantly located in the southeast region of the U.S. Jurisdictions in the north, southeast, and the U.S. Virgin Islands reported the highest proportions of clients identifying as people of color. ADAPs in the west and southwest (Arizona, California, New Mexico, and Texas) as well as Puerto Rico serve the highest proportion of clients of Hispanic ethnicity (i.e., more than 40%).


Effective antiretroviral (ARV) regimens have allowed PLWH, including ADAP clients, to have longer lifespans and experience fewer HIV-related conditions (e.g., opportunistic infections). As a result, the proportion of ADAP clients who are older has and will continue to grow. In calendar year 2016, 56% of ADAP clients were aged 45 years or older. In 2006, 43% of ADAP clients served were aged 45 years or older, a significant shift over a ten-year interval.

As ADAPs have evolved their systems and bolstered their internal data infrastructure and capacity, they have increasingly been able to capture client level data that reflects health inequities and allows them to target their services.

For all clients, 23 ADAPs reported that 5% of their clients met the HIV transmission criteria for injection drug use and 24 ADAPs reported that 47% of their clients met the HIV transmission criteria for male-to-male sexual contact.

### CHART 11 ADAP Clients Served, by Race, Calendar Year 2016













### ADAP Clients Served, by Income, Calendar Year 2016




<50% Clents Served Incomes ≤139 FPL (23 ADAPs)

Among clients that met the male-to-male sexual contact criteria, 24 ADAPs reported that 82% of these individuals were virally suppressed based on their last viral load reported for calendar year 2016. By comparison, 81% of all ADAP clients in these jurisdictions were reported as being virally suppressed.

Per the Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Adolescent and Adult HIV/AIDS Treatment Guidelines, all PLWH should be screened for HCV and those at high risk for acquiring HCV should be screened annually. In a letter sent to ADAPs in February 2015, HRSA/HAB encouraged ADAPs to add HCV treatment to their formularies. Over 1,000 clients (2%) across 15 ADAPs were reported as being co-infected with hepatitis C (HCV) at some point during calendar year 2016; 336 (32%) of these clients received HCV treatment while 160 (48%) were reported as cured. Of note, these values likely indicate underreporting as a result of limited data available to ADAPs. As of January 1, 2017, 39 ADAPs covered one or more HCV treatment medication on their formulary, while 31 covered one or more directly-acting antiviral (DAA) HCV treatment medication. Per NASTAD's direct solicitation, ADAPs have observed modest utilization of DAA HCV treatment among their clients and have been challenged in capturing key HCV-related client level data (e.g., number of clients co-infected with HCV, number of clients treated who subsequently achieved sustained virologic response (SVR)). Impediments to ADAPs' provision of DAA HCV treatment to their co-infected clients include: low rates for screening and confirmatory testing as well as an absence of nationally-coordinated HCV surveillance activities; providers and clients challenged in navigating a burdensome and confusing payer landscape; and insufficient provider capacity or willingness to treat, particularly in more rural areas or among clients with active substance use.

By documenting and measuring health outcomes among these clients, ADAPs are poised to direct services and funding to those individuals who would most benefit. In doing so, ADAPs contribute to efforts to mitigate barriers to achieving viral load suppression as part of the broader RWHAP Part B program. Further, RWHAP Part B programs' outreach services may assist ADAPs in directing resources to these clients.




### WHAT DO THE RWHAP PART B/ ADAP CLIENTS NEED BEYOND HIV TREATMENT AND CARE?


RWHAP Part B programs structure and deploy a full range of services that best respond to the needs of key subpopulations among their clients. These include those services that go beyond HIV care yet are responsive to the unique challenges faced by clients experiencing complex comorbid conditions or structural barriers that affect their continuous engagement in care and viral load suppression. Below are four examples of groups that particularly benefit from a coordinated response spanning the totality of the RWHAP Part B program:

- PLWH Co-infected with HCV: Persons co-infected with HIV and HCV need more than medications to treat these conditions. HIV/HCV co-infected RWHAP Part B program clients can benefit from a multidisciplinary care model that includes HIV/HCV treatment and case management, and as necessary, housing, mental health, and substance use services. Justice-involved individuals experience higher rates of HIV/HCV co-infection and face unique challenges that may impede treatment, including a disproportionate burden of behavioral health conditions (i.e., mental health, substance use). In calendar year 2016, 2% of clients served by those 15 ADAPs able to report were HCV-coinfected.
- Justice-involved populations: HIV prevalence is higher among individuals incarcerated in state prisons than in the national population and an estimated one in seven PLWH are incarcerated at some point in their lives. Justice-involved individuals, including those living with HIV, are highly impacted by behavioral health conditions (i.e., mental health, substance use) and other chronic infectious disease (e.g., HCV). As of January 1, 2017, 19 RWHAP Part B programs/ADAPs, provided services to individuals currently incarcerated in city, county, or local jails or state prisons as they prepare to exit the incarceration system as part of effective discharge planning or when they are in the system for a brief period.





- Thirty-three RWHAP Part B programs/ADAPs provided services to individuals recently released from incarceration. Among these RWHAP Part B programs/ADAPs, 37% and 21% provide HCV treatment medications to clients currently incarcerated vs. recently released from incarceration.
- Aging PLWH: The majority of all RWHAP Part B clients (53%) served in calendar year 2016 were aged 45 and older. Non-HIV-related conditions now account for the majority of morbidity and mortality among PLWH and occur at higher rates than among persons not living with HIV. RWHAP services such as Food Bank/Home-Delivered Meals, Home Health Care, Home and Community-Based Health Services, Medical/ Non-Medical Case Management, and Medical Transportation are all effective in addressing declining acuity and mobility among older PLWH. ADAPs may coordinate with Medicare (i.e., pay towards premiums, co-payments, deductibles) and may include aging-specific comorbid condition treatments (e.g., cardiac medications, metabolic agents, neuropathy medications) on their formularies. As of January 1, 2017, 45 ADAPs cover (i.e., pay in full or in part for) Medicare premiums; 43 ADAPs cover Medicare deductibles; and 49 ADAPs cover Medicare co-payments.
- PLWH Impacted by Substance Use: Individuals with substance use disorders may not seek treatment because of inadequate screening, stigma, or a lack of available and adequate services. Persons living with substance use are also more vulnerable to homelessness or being unstably housed. In January 2016, 20% of all persons experiencing homelessness were estimated to have a chronic substance use disorder. In calendar year 2016, 26 RWHAP Part B programs funded Substance Use Outpatient Care and three funded Substance Use Services Residential. Expenditures for both service categories made up 0.2% of the total RWHAP Part B program expenditures for calendar year 2016.

RWHAP Part B programs have over 25 years of experience in serving PLWH with complex needs and who are vulnerable to persistent and systemic barriers.



#### CHART 16 RWHAP Part B Clients Served, by Demographic, Calendar Year 2016




#### CHART 17 ADAP Clients Served, by Demographic, Calendar Year 2016



#### CHART 18 RWHAP Part B/ADAP Provision of Services for Incarcerated Individuals, Calendar Year 2016




#### CHART 19 Top ADAP Services Provided to Incarcerated Individuals, Calendar Year 2016

# WHAT'S AT STAKE IN A CHANGING HEALTH CARE LANDSCAPE


### HEALTH CARE SYSTEM POLICY CHANGE IMPLICATIONS

In March 2010, President Obama signed into law the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Affordable Care Act, ACA). Since its implementation, the ACA has had a demonstrative impact on RWHAP Part B programs and ADAPs as well as the clients they serve. The ACA has allowed these programs to repurpose expenditures associated with paying full cost for clients for medications by migrating clients towards Medicaid (particularly in those states that have expanded Medicaid) or enrolling them in less costly and more comprehensive insurance coverage within the federal or state marketplaces. As a result, the percentage of ADAP clients served by the ADAP-funded insurance program has grown 17% between 2013 and 2016.

In calendar year 2016, 50% of all ADAP clients at or below 139% FPL were served in the 19 ADAPs in non-Medicaid expansion states. More than 28,000 ADAP clients served were also Medicaid-eligible at some point during the calendar year (e.g., churned between ADAP and Medicaid as the result of a changes in income). Should Medicaid expansion be terminated and/or changed from an entitlement program (i.e., where states receive federal funding proportional to the number of enrollees) to a block grant structure (i.e., where states receive a set and finite federal funding amount regardless of number of enrollees), PLWH in these states may no longer be

- Medicaid expansion states





eligible for Medicaid and/or may be offered reduced coverage and services. In either case, as payers of last resort, ADAPs may be forced to restructure their program to serve these added clients and associated costs. In effect, they may return to the pre-ACA status quo where tens of thousands of ADAP clients did not have comprehensive insurance coverage and relied on ADAP to pay the full cost of their medications.

## CHANGES TO ADAP IMPACT THE BROADER RWHAP PART B PROGRAM


In 2016, <u>535,157</u> PLWH received services from RWHAP-funded providers. This represents nearly half of all the estimated <u>1.1</u> <u>million PLWH in the United States</u>. Within the RWHAP Part B program, 253,331 received core medical and/or support services in 2016 while 230,379 were served by ADAP. As RWHAP Part B programs/ADAPs served over half of all RWHAP clients and one-quarter of all PLWH nationally, they are a critical component to the public health and health care infrastructures necessary to achieving the goals of the National HIV/AIDS Strategy. Their effectiveness and reach is contingent on their ability to remain nimble in an evolving health care landscape.

Expenditures for ADAP medication purchasing and insurance continuation have decreased as more clients are served by ADAP-funded insurance with significantly lower costs per client as compared to the full-pay prescription program. As such, many jurisdictions have rededicated dollars to supplement and bolster other elements of the RWHAP Part B program infrastructure and service delivery. This includes expansions in staff, quality management, data systems, training, and direct service provision. Numerous services RWHAP Part B programs provide are often not covered by or billable to private




insurance (e.g., medical transportation) yet are still necessary for clients. Between calendar year 2015 and 2016, 15 RWHAP Part B programs reported increases in the number of clients served in core medical and support services. The largest increases were reported among Medical Transportation Services (support service, n=26), Medical Case Management (core medical, n=24), and Oral Health Care (core medical, n=23). These represent critical expansions in services that support RWHAP Part B clients in remaining in medical care, achieving viral load suppression and thus eliminating their risk of sexually transmitting HIV. They are also contributions towards nationwide efforts to achieve ends to the HIV epidemic in local jurisdictions and states.

### CHART 23 ADAP Clients Served by Insurance Continuation, by Insurance Payment Type, Calendar Year 2016



### CHART 24 ADAP Clients Served by Medicaid Expansion State, by Viral Load, Calendar Year 2016





However, in addition to new income counting rules for most Medicaid populations (called "Modified Adjusted Gross Income"), there is an additional 5% disregard of income, effectively bumping the Medicaid income eligibility threshold to 138% FPL.






### Effectiveness of ADAP-funded insurance reduced





### **METHODOLOGY**

Since 2016, NASTAD's National RWHAP Part B and ADAP Monitoring Project has surveyed all jurisdictions receiving federal RWHAP Part B and ADAP funding through the RWHAP. From 1996 to 2015, the National ADAP Monitoring Project surveyed all jurisdictions receiving federal ADAP earmark funding through the RWHAP. In FY2017, 59 jurisdictions received federal RWHAP Part B base funding and were surveyed; 53 responded. American Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Marshall Islands, Northern Mariana Islands, and Republic of Palau did not respond. This 23rd release of the *Annual Report* updates prior findings with data from calendar year 2016 and RWHAP Part B programs' fiscal year 2016. The *Annual Report* reflects the latest available data and discusses recent policy and programmatic changes affecting RWHAP Part B programs. After the survey is distributed, NASTAD conducts extensive follow-up to ensure completion by as many RWHAP Part B programs as possible.

All data reflect the status of RWHAP Part B programs as reported by survey respondents. It is important to note that some program information may have changed between data collection and the *Annual Report's* release. Due to differences in data collection and availability across RWHAP Part B programs, some are not able to respond to all survey questions. Where trend data are presented, only states that provided data in relevant periods are included. In some cases, RWHAP Part B and ADAP programs have provided revised program data from prior years and these revised data are incorporated where possible. Therefore, data from prior year reports may not be comparable for assessing trends. Data exceptions specific to a particular jurisdiction are provided in the notes section on relevant charts and tables.
