ADAPs with Waiting Lists (346 individuals, as of November 13, 2009)

Arkansas: 9 individuals
Iowa: 25 individuals
Kentucky: 120 individuals
Montana: 19 individuals
Nebraska: 32 individuals
South Dakota: 13 individuals
Tennessee: 80 individuals
Utah: 36 individuals
Wyoming: 12 individuals

ADAPs with Other Cost-containment Strategies (instituted since April 1, 2009)

Arkansas: reduced formulary, lowered financial eligibility
Iowa: reduced formulary
Nebraska: reduced formulary
North Dakota: cap on Fuzeon
Utah: reduced formulary, lowered financial eligibility
Washington: client cost sharing, reduced formulary (for uninsured clients only)

ADAPs Considering New/Additional Cost-containment Measures (before March 31, 2010*)

Idaho: waiting list
Indiana: capped enrollment, waiting list
Kentucky: reduced formulary, client cost sharing
Missouri: reduced formulary
North Dakota: capped enrollment, waiting list, reduced formulary, annual expenditure cap
South Dakota: reduced formulary
Wyoming: lowered financial eligibility, annual expenditure cap
Washington: reduced formulary (for uninsured clients only)
