340B BASICS REVIEW

- Part 1: 340B Basics for Viral Hepatitis Programs available here
- Summary:
 - 340B is a federal program administered by HRSA Office of Pharmacy Affairs (OPA)
 - Eligibility is dependent on the grant or funding a provider receives, and patients must meet a 3-part definition
 - All grant authorized by Section 318 of the Public Health Service Act are eligible
 - Integrated Viral Hepatitis Surveillance and Prevention Funding for Health Departments
 - Integrated HIV Surveillance and Prevention Programs for Health Departments
 - Strengthening STD Prevention and Control for Health Departments
 - 340B allows revenue to be generated or significant savings to be had

HEALTH DEPARTMENT ROLES

- Health Departments may be the covered entity
- Health Departments may be the administrators of funding that covered entities receive
- Health Departments may be a covered entity and also provide funding and support to other covered entities




340B REGISTRATION

- Remember: *eligible* entities serving *eligible* patients
- 4 annual registration periods
 - The first 15 days of every quarter
- Registration is done at the service level site
 - A state-level administrator <u>should not</u> register their contractor or partner



340B REGISTRATION CHECKLIST


- ✓ Determine who your authorizing official is
- ✓ Determine who your primary contact will be
- ✓ Create an account in the <u>HRSA Office</u> of <u>Pharmacy Affairs 340B Information</u> System
- ✓ Know your NOFO and grant number
- ✓ Know if you receive direct financial assistance or in-kind support
- ✓ Your contract pharmacy will need to register too!
- ✓ Add noreply@hrsa.gov to your email program's spam filter



NEW REQUIREMENT

- As of August 1, 2020 STD/TB/RW entities are required to enter the following in 340B OPAIS at the time of registration:
 - The notice of funding opportunity number
 - The date range of their NOFO funding
 - The type of in-kind support they are receiving (if appliable)

*Active STD/TB/RW entities will be required to update this information during their next recertification submission

AUTHORIZING OFFICIAL

Authorizing Official:

• The authorizing official represents the covered entity and must be fully authorized to legally bind the covered entity. The authorizing official must annually recertify covered entity eligibility, attest to compliance with all program requirements, verify contract pharmacy arrangements, and receive all communications from HRSA regarding the 340B program, including audit reports. For many non-hospital covered entities, the authorizing official is the grantee of record based upon federal funding streams. For hospital covered entities, the authorizing official is usually the CEO, CFO, COO/President/Vice President or equivalent.

Primary Contact:

• A secondary contact for the covered entity. Receives information and reminders from HRSA. They do not have authority to update or change any items within OPAIS

ANNUAL RECERTIFICATION

- Once registered, entities must recertify annually during the designated period to remain in the program
- Advance email notifications with preliminary information about the recertification process are sent to both the Primary Contact Authorizing Official
- Recertification is done through OPAIS
- Failure to recertify will result in termination from the 340B program



VIRAL HEPATITIS PROGRAM EXAMPLE

- The Rainbow Brite Center:
 - An eligible provider serving eligible patients
 - They receive funding from a section 318 grant (PS21-2103)
 - They employ medical providers, have established relationships with their patients, maintain records, and provide services that are consistent with their qualifying funding
 - Contracts with the State Health Department
 - Has gotten the NOFO number and grant number
 - Has a contract pharmacy
 - Ready to Register!
 - Enrolls on July 1, can access 340B priced medications on October 1
 - Generates revenue and can now pay their bill from the Public Health Laboratory and also hire another navigator
